1. Introduction: what a publication scheme is and why it has been developed

One of the aims of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (which is referred to as FOIA in the rest of this document) is that public authorities, including all maintained schools, should be clear and proactive about the information they will make public.

To do this they must produce a publication scheme, setting out:

- the classes of information which they publish or intend to publish;
- the manner in which the information will be published; and
- whether the information is available free of charge or on payment.

The scheme covers information already published and information which is to be published in the future. All information in this publication scheme is either available for you on the College website to download and print off or available in paper form.

Some information which we hold may not be made public, for example, personal information.

This publication scheme conforms to the model scheme for schools approved by the Information Commissioner.

3. Categories Of Information Published

| Sex Education Policy | Statement of policy with regard to sex and relationship education. |
| Special Education Needs Policy | Information about the school's policy on providing for pupils with special educational needs. (To be completed Summer 2004). |
| Accessibility Plans | Plan for increasing participation of disabled pupils in the school's curriculum, improving the accessibility of the physical environment and improving delivery of information to disabled pupils. (Subsumed within SEN policy). |
| Race Equality Policy | Statement of policy for promoting race equality. (Subsumed within Anti-bullying Policy). |
| Collective Worship | Statement of arrangements for the required daily act of collective worship. |

| Staff Conduct, Discipline and Grievance | Statement of procedure for regulating conduct and discipline of school staff and procedures by which staff may seek redress for grievance. (In Teachers' Pay and Conditions). |
| Curriculum circulars and statutory instruments | Any statutory instruments, departmental circulars and administrative memoranda sent by the Department of Education and Skills to the head teacher or governing body relating to the curriculum. |
| Annex A – Other documents | Annex A provides a list of other documents that are held by the school and are available on request. |
